

# *Club House and Course Dress Code*

## **Club Dress Code**

The aim of the dress code is to operate a policy which enables everyone concerned to play golf and enjoy their time in the clubhouse, respect the views of fellow members and guests and respect the standards expected in such a club.

The dress code also aims to recognise the changes in dress fashion, and be compatible with the rules of golf

## **Golf Course Dress Code**

- Smart casual attire which is widely accepted golf attire
- Tailored shorts with matching long socks or predominately white short socks
- Shirts to have collar/Roll Neck, sleeves, and to be tucked into trousers
- Golf Shoes

The following attire is not allowed on the Course

- Trousers tucked into socks
- Jeans
- Common exclusions detailed below

## **Clubhouse / Patio Dress Code**

- Smart casual attire
- Tailored Shorts with socks
- Shirts to have collar/Roll Neck, sleeves, and to be tucked into trousers
- Players may wear the same clothes that they have played in providing they are not wet through rain and/or perspiration or soiled in any way
- Jeans

The following attire is not allowed in the Club House or on the Patio

- Common exclusions detailed below
- No hats, caps, topcoats, waterproof clothing or any ripped, wet or soiled clothing, golf shoes or golf equipment is acceptable with the clubhouse

The following **Common Exclusions are not allowed** on the Course, Patio or in the Clubhouse

- Cargo Trousers/Shorts
- Other Denim and Camouflage attire
- Trousers worn in such a way that under garments are visible
- Shorts that are not tailored
- Shorts without socks
- T-Shirts, Football Shirts, Sun Tops, beach wear
- Sleeveless and/or collarless Shirts
- Track or Shell Suits
- Trainers
- Hooded Tops.
